"Then they went out of the city and came to Him." John 4:30

"So when the Samaritans had come to Him, they urged Him to stay with them; and He stayed there two days.

And many more believed because of His own word." John 4:40-41

 - i) Through hearing
 - ii) Through raising of questions

3. This is indeed the Christ

- a) The Anointed One sent by God
- b) He is the Christ

4. The Saviour of the world

- a) Not just of the Jews
- b) But of the Samaritans
- c) And of the world
