3. Providentially he was urged to study the Scriptures by his superior

- a) Devoted his life to become a Doctor of the Bible
- b) Studied the Scriptures against the background of the Roman Church
- c) Began to declare his teachings openly:
 - i) Salvation is through justification by God
 - ii) Salvation is by grace through faith in Jesus
 - iii) The Scriptures are the only source of authority
 - iv) The sale of indulgences (forgiveness of sin through payment of money) is wrong
