

#### THE DANGER OF THE LOSS OF SIGNIFICANCE

This can occur subtly and almost imperceptibly.

- 1. The passing of time can dent its significance
- 2. Regularity of celebrating an annual event can cause us to take things for granted
- 3. Worse is the danger of losing a vital sense of vibrancy in our faith-relationship with the Lord our Saviour.

Let us do everything possible to ensure that we do not forget the significance of the Lord sending us a wonderful Saviour in the Lord Jesus Christ.

#### THE PROMISE OF A SAVIOUR

The promise of a Saviour was first given in prophecy. The prophet Isaiah proclaimed numerous aspects of the Messiah-Saviour. One of the titles given to the Messiah was "Immanuel."

Therefore the LORD Himself will give you a sign: Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a Son, And shall call His name Immanuel. Isaiah 7:14

- 1. The promise of a Saviour
  - a) His birth would be a miracle
  - b) It would be a sign from God Himself
- 2. The presence of God
  - a) The name "Immanuel" is to be appreciated
  - b) His name is of great symbolic significance
- 3. Personal significance
  - a) This is our challenge personally

- 1. The Lord Jesus was described as the chief cornerstone
- But He was rejected by the builders
   This was a reference to the chief priests and scribes who ruled in religious matters.
- 3. This was a prophetic word that was fulfilled by Jesus

# **WORSHIP IN SPIRIT AND TRUTH**

#### Psalm 105:9-12

- 1. The Covenant God gave:
  - a) It was originally given to Abraham
  - b) This was ratified with Isaac
  - c) It was further confirmed with Jacob
- 2. Features of the Covenant in this context
  - a) It was an everlasting covenant
  - b) It included giving to Israel a homeland
  - c) This was an inheritance that would be perpetual
- 3. An important insight
  - a) Israel was but a small group of people when they went to Egypt
  - b) They were indeed very few and they were foreigners there
  - c) The Covenant included God's special protection
- 4. Our worship of God
  - a) To remember Him as a Covenant-keeping God
  - b) To appreciate Him for His protection and provision
  - c) To fear the Lord for being faithful and wonderfully gracious

# THE SPRINKLING OF THE BLOOD OF JESUS CHRIST

The Old Testament contained important teachings, About how Man may approach God through cleansing. Man cannot take for granted the greatness of the LORD; Thus, he must pay close attention to the Biblical record.

An approach to God must be presented with the shedding of blood.

Man's sinfulness caused him to be under a dark and somber cloud.

An atonement for sin must be made to a holy God;

Only then would he be accepted by the Lord.

The Covenant that God made with Israel was given graciously; The blood of oxen was sprinkled on the altar and the people duly. That signified the confirmation of the Covenant with Israel; The challenge was to make the Covenant relationship real.

Then God gave a New Covenant through Jesus our Saviour; All may become children of God and receive His gracious favour. It required the shedding and the sprinkling of the blood of the Lord; Faith helps us to deeply appreciate our reconciliation to God.
